



Come for an in-depth, informational evening that will answer questions about the challenges facing teens today on the topics of addiction – both online and drugs and alcohol, cell phone use and abuse, eating disorders, stress management and anxiety. College Park TAFE is working diligently to implement the TAFE Special Edition division for special Texas Association of Future Educators needs TAFE members. Ashton Waguespack, Lauren Villarreal, Victoria Arp and Peyton Eisinger are

paving the way for future TAFE special needs members. Ashton has chosen to not only be the leader of the team at College Park to implement the TAFE Special Edition Division, she is determined to have a positive impact on all TAFE Chapters across the state, thereby reaching special needs students across the state.

In her journey to assist TAFE in becoming more inclusive, Ashton decided to create demonstration videos. The "How To" videos assist special needs competitors learn about the different events available. The videos also give the students an idea of how one could develop a project for the different events. Ashton realized the videos may help special needs students have the courage and confidence to step out of their comfort zone and compete in a TAFE competition with the support of their other TAFE members.

The videos detail step-by-step directions for special needs students wanting to plan a TAFE project. She shares steps to take before, during and after the competition. In addition, Ashton shows completed project examples to give students a visual to accompany the auditory presentation of the video. Finally, Ashton presents a completed project to show how one could share one's project with the judges.

Not only has Ashton created the videos, she emailed a letter to the TAFE State Director, Mrs. Donita Garza, explaining the demonstration videos and her vision of how they may be an asset to other TAFE Chapters across

the state. Mrs. Garza was so impressed with the videos, she posted them online as a resource for all TAFE Chapters in the state of Texas to encourage more chapters to include special needs students in the chapters as well as in their competitions through the TAFE Special Edition Division. Mrs. Garza stated the videos and Ashton are a "blessing to her and all students in Texas."


Finally, Ashton is also creating a "How to Implement TAFE Special Edition Handbook" for advisors. The handbook details how to begin the new division on one's campus. It includes the forms and resources created by College Park TAFE. Mrs. Donita Garza has stated as soon as it is ready, she would like to post it online at the state TAFE website as well for all advisors to access across the state. Lastly, Ashton will lead her team as they present the videos and handbook to TAFE members and advisors at the state conference in February, 2019.
