In 2017, Children In Santa's Dreams provided gifts to 822 children in 350 families.



Families in Transition Program

Who we are: We are community volunteers who support homeless, vulnerable students and their families in Conroe ISD.

What we do: Provide support in transition including temporary transportation, tutoring and meeting basic needs (i.e. food, warm clothes).

Why are we doing this? Conroe ISD has over 1,000 students who are potentially homeless and we want to help them however we can.

How can you help? First, sign up <u>HERE</u> on Conroe ISD's website as a volunteer. We are NOT part of CISD but their background checks help provide security for the families in need. After you receive an e-mail from CISD stating you passed the background check, forward that e-mail to info@fitmoco.org with your name, e-mail and phone number to be added to the contact list. Then, review the e-mails (sent out around the 1st and 15th of each month)

of any needs you can meet!

Contact us at info@fitmoco.org if you have any questions, concerns or know of families who are in need.

Please send a note with your child and have them drop off the note at the attend-



ance office (located at the front entrance of the school) preferably before school begins. Your child will receive a pass to be released from class at the time specified on the note. We DO NOT release students to Uber Drivers or Taxi Service for ANY rea-

son.

The note should include:

o Student's Name o Date of Release

Time of Release o Parent /Guardian Name and Signature o Contact Phone Numbers o Permission to Drive Off Campus (if applicable)

You can also call the school to request an early release for your student. Please call at least 1 hour in advance in order to give the student office-aides ample time to locate your student. A pass to leave early will not be sent to a student if we do not receive the request before 1:30 pm.





On Wednesday, November 14th, the Varsity "B" team finished 4th and the JV boys finished 8th at the Magnolia West Invitational held at High Meadow Ranch. Leading the team was Max Cas-
