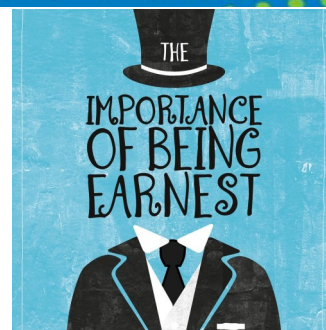

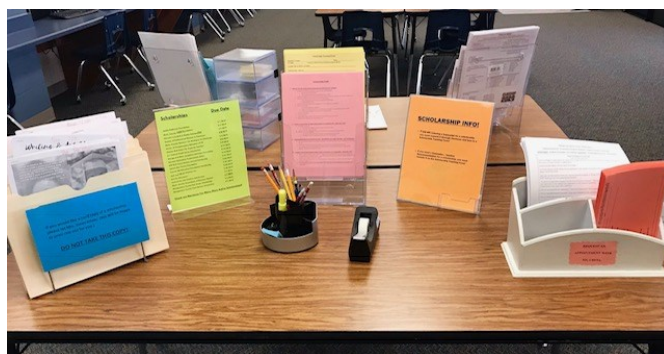

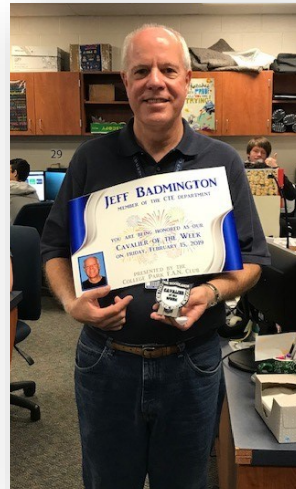

College Park High School FCCLA began this school year.

Region IV hosted the Regional Conference and Competition February 14 – 16, 2019 in Galveston, Texas. College Park High School competed in 8 team events and 4 individual events. Each competitor did a great job representing CP FCCLA. There were some competitors who excelled in their event. College Park is advancing to state in 6 team events and 1 individual event. To qualify for the state competition, competitors must score in the top five of their events and meet a minimum score requirement.

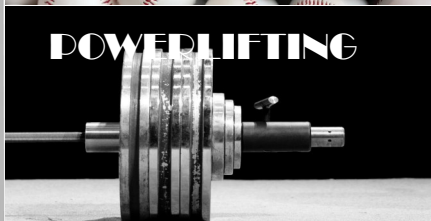
