



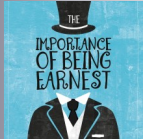

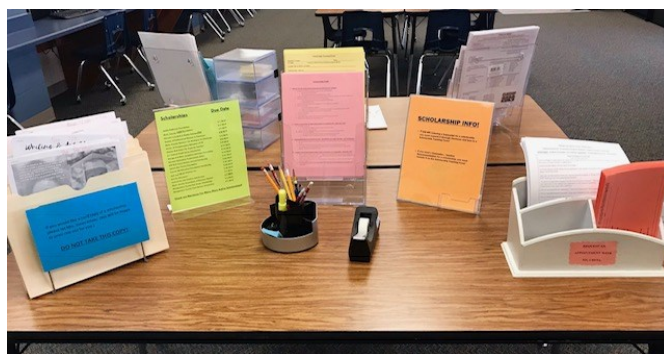

AST students return their application to Ms. Priser.

Students not in AST return their application to Ms. Creel in the College and Career Center.

If you have specific questions such as a conflict with the Ironman requirement, contact EFTA, not Ms. Creel or Ms. Priser. EFTA contact is Corinne Coulter: 936-271-6153|

Students will still select their top three choices from the job description list and be placed based on the positions available and their application. EFTA and all school representatives will meet to go over placements. Job descriptions are found on the above website.

There are a couple of requirements and details that I wanted to make known in case your students have questions:

- Students are expected to complete a minimum of 80 hours at their internship assignment. The suggested work period is between June 3, and July 26, 2019. The student should plan to work 40 hours per week for two consecutive weeks. Some host companies have required work dates that may be on the job description list.

- Applicants are required to complete volunteer hours at the IRONMAN Texas Triathlon on Saturday, April 27 as part of the application process. Students need to register for their four-hour volunteer shift through EfTA by the application deadline of April 3. Applicants MUST register through the EfTA website to volunteer for either the Run Special Needs, Timing or Sunscreen station. If an applicant is unable to commit to this, he/she may be allowed with advanced approval to make up the time by doing 10 hours of community service at another time. Documentation will be required. Please note that a student's volunteer service at the IRONMAN event does not guarantee his/her top choice internship placement.

- Students need to attend an orientation at the Lone Star College- Montgomery Campus on either Monday, April 29 or Thursday, May 2 from 3:30 pm - 5:30 pm in order to receive their placement information and learn about the program guidelines. Please remind students who do not get placed right away to keep checking their emails. New internships continue to be confirmed into June and students who respond will be the ones to get the opportunities.

- Participants must return verification paperwork from the employer to school counselors by Friday, May 24.

- There is a Student Internship Program luncheon the week of June 24. Students are expected to attend with their intern mentor to successfully complete the program. Attendance does not count towards the 80-hour requirement.

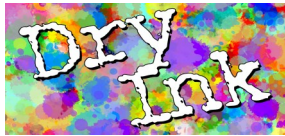

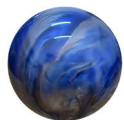

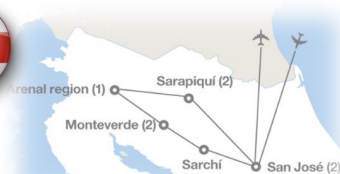

## College Park Excels During the 2019 TAFE Teach Tomorrow Summit

The College Park chapter of Texas Association of Future Educators (TAFE) attended the TAFE Teach Tomorrow Summit at new The Delta Hotel and Watters Creek Convention Center, in Allen, TX, February 27 – March 2, 2019. TAFE is a statewide co-curricular Career and Technical Student Organization created to allow young men and women an opportunity to explore the teaching profession. Attendees to this three-day conference included members of TAFE, which consisted of approximately 2,300 students, interested in becoming educators.

While at the conference, the students participated in competitive events. The competitive events are designed to offer future educators exciting, authentic opportunities to measure their creativity, skills, and initiative against high standards and against their peers from across the state. There are 35 competitive events and 18 of those events advance to nationals. The students who placed in the top 5 in each of the national events have the opportunity to advance to the Educators Rising National Conference, June 21-25, 2019, in Dallas, Texas.

College Park Qualified for Nationals in 3 events by performing in the top 5 of those events. This is the third year in a row College Park has qualified for Nationals. The following students qualified for Nationals: Ashton Waguespack, Lauren Villarreal, Ryan Winkler, Wendy West, Sara Muschenheim, Victoria Arp and Denisse Cabrera. Ryan Winkler qualified as the first student ever from a CISD school to qualify for Nationals in two events!

However, the awards and honors did not stop with the National Qualifiers. College Park also won 13 Blue Ribbons for Excellence, 1 Red Ribbon of Recognition and 1 Gold Certificate of Excellence in the state events. College Park had 25 students presented with awards.

On Saturday afternoon, the new officer team for 2019-2020 was elected to continue the mission of TAFE and to inspire “The Hope for Tomorrow.” Denisse Cabrera from College Park was sworn in as the TAFE State Vice President. Denisse is the first CISD student to hold a TAFE state officer position.

College Park students represented the teaching profession, College Park and CISD with poise, integrity and professionalism. CISD will be blessed when these future educators return to CISD as teachers in a few short years. Our future is bright due to the gifts and talents of these young Cavaliers!

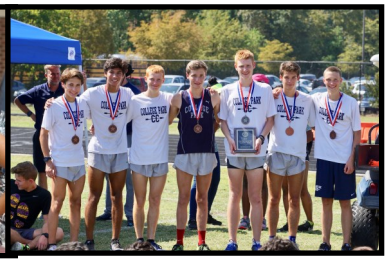
