AST students return their application to Ms. Priser.

Students not in AST return their application to Ms. Creel in the College and Career Center.

If you have specific questions such as a conflict with the Ironman requirement, contact EFTA, not Ms. Creel or Ms. Priser. EFTA contact is Corinne Coulter: 936-271-6153|

Students will still select their top three choices from the job description list and be placed based on the positions available and their application. EFTA and all school representatives will meet to go over placements. Job descriptions are found on the above website.

There are a couple of requirements and details that I wanted to make known in case your students have questions:

- Students are expected to complete a minimum of 80 hours at their internship assignment. The suggested work period is between June 3, and July 26, 2019. The student should plan to work 40 hours per week for two consecutive weeks. Some host companies have required work dates that may be on the job description list.

- Applicants are required to complete volunteer hours at the IRONMAN Texas Triathlon on Saturday, April 27 as part of the application process. Students need to register for their four-hour volunteer shift through EfTA by the application deadline of April 3. Applicants MUST register through the EfTA website to volunteer for either the Run Special Needs, Timing or Sunscreen station. If an applicant is unable to commit to this, he/she may be allowed with advanced approval to make up the time by doing 10 hours of community service at another time. Documentation will be required. Please note that a student's volunteer service at the IRONMAN event does not guarantee his/her top choice internship placement.

- Students need to attend an orientation at the Lone Star College- Montgomery Campus on either Monday, April 29 or Thursday, May 2 from 3:30 pm - 5:30 pm in order to receive their placement information and learn about the program guidelines. Please remind students who do not get placed right away to keep checking their emails. New internships continue to be confirmed into June and students who respond will be the ones to get the opportunities.

- Participants must return verification paperwork from the employer to school counselors by Friday, May 24.

- There is a Student Internship Program luncheon the week of June 24. Students are expected to attend with their intern mentor to successfully complete the program. Attendance does not count towards the 80-hour requirement.

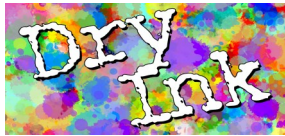
