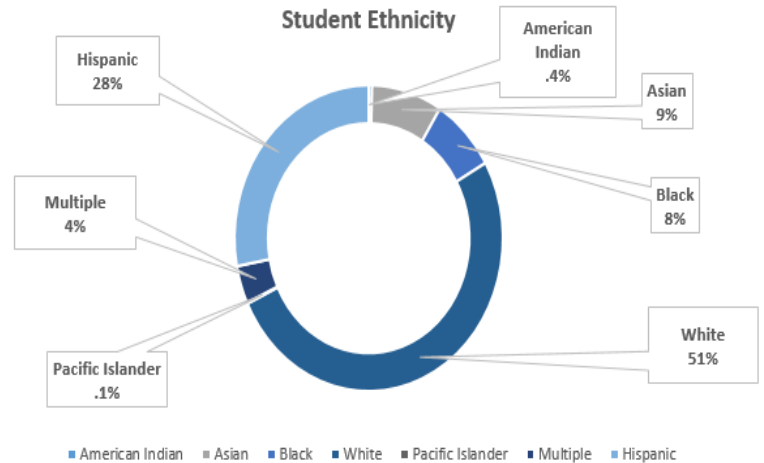

Our District

Conroe Independent School District is the 11th largest school district in Texas, comprised of more than 65,000 students attending more than 60 schools across six traditional feeder zones, and one academic alternative high school. Three specialized competitive magnet programs are available for students.

Our Community

The Woodlands, one of the nation's premier master planned communities, is home to more than 100,000 people. The Woodlands is just 27 miles north of downtown Houston and is an important regional center for more than 1000 businesses. Most residents in this upscale suburb are employed in professional or managerial positions with an average family income of \$110,000.

Our COVID 19 Response

For the last quarter of the 2019-2020 school year, Conroe ISD provided asynchronous learning for all grades. Technology and Wifi hotspots were made available (paper packets upon request). Students produced a minimum of one graded assignment per week in each course, and teachers provided daily feedback and virtual tutorial help. Dual credit students completed all college assignments in addition to meeting the high school expectations. All CISD Advanced Placement students participated in virtual supplemental reviews along with coursework to prepare for exams.

For the 2020-2021 academic year, students can choose in person or remote learning. The entire district began the school year online on August 13th until September 8th when in person learners returned to campus. Students choose each quarter to either remain in person or remain remote learners. At College Park, approximately 60% of students returned in person for the first quarter, while 40% of students remained remote. District wide, students will earn the same credits, and use the same grading scale both in person or remote. Remote students are still allowed to participate in extra curricular activities or attend a particular class (such as a lab science or AP course) during the day.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS-ACADEMY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

The Woodlands College Park High School houses the Academy of Science and Technology. The Academy is a group of students (75 per grade), competitively selected across three feeder zones, whose curriculum focuses on science and technology. Academy students take their science, math, and technology classes within the Academy setting. Academy teachers work collaboratively with the faculty and staff of The Woodlands College Park High School to enhance the curriculum and special interests of Academy students.

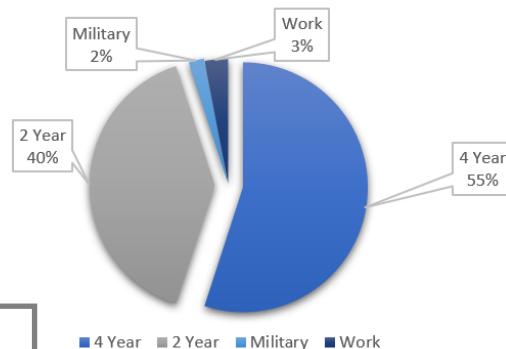
Our Schedule

The Woodlands College Park High School's school day consists of a traditional seven period day with each period approximately 50 minutes. Students at College Park are expected to graduate on the Texas Foundation with endorsement plan including: 4 credits in English, 4 credits of Math (to include Algebra 2), 4 credits of Science (Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Principles of Technology, and 1 additional science), 4 credits of Social Studies, 2 Foreign Language, a fine arts course, one credit of physical education, and Health. Class rank is based on the cumulative grade point average for grades 9-12. A student's grade point average is determined by dividing the total number of grade points by the number of semester courses attempted. All state accredited courses are considered in the calculation. Grade points are awarded according to course rigor.
