Exemption Policy

2020-2021 School Year

Seniors (Grade 12) (Spring Exams Only except for Government or Economics)

Number of Exemptions allowed for a Senior:

- 1) 1st Semester – Government and/or Economics
- 2) Spring Semester – All courses

Grade Qualification:

- 1) Current semester average, at the time of the eligible course exemption, of at least a 70.

Missing Assignments:

1. No zeros for any Major Grades in both the 3rd or 4th nine weeks.
2. No more than 3 zeros for Daily Grades for the 3rd nine weeks, and no more than 3 zeros for Daily Grade for the 4th nine weeks.
3. X = Exempt; Z = Zero

Discipline Qualification:

- 1) ISS Assignments – Zero for either semester
- 2) DAEP/JAEP assignments – Zero for either semester

Hold List Qualification:

- 1) A student may not be on the hold list at the time of the exemption. This list includes payments owed, fines, fees, equipment, uniforms, books, instruments, or other school items not returned or lost.

Administration may change the decision of the exemption for students based on extenuating circumstances. Assistant principals will review and make a recommendation to the Associate Principal of Administration for approval.

Hold List:

The hold list is developed based on items the student needs to return or pay the school: payment owed, fines, fees, equipment, uniforms, books, instruments, or other school items not returned or lost, etc.

Exemption Coupons:

Exemption coupons will be issued to the students one week prior to exams. Once the coupons are issued, no reprints will occur for any reason. If a student's exemption status changes after the coupon has been given to a teacher, the student will lose that exemption coupon and will not be reissued that coupon for a different exam (Example: The student meets the criteria for an exemption and turns in the coupon to a teacher. The student earns a zero for a major grade. The student is no longer exempt and that coupon is no longer available for another class).

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Exemption Policy

2020-2021 School Year

Underclassmen (Grades 9-11) (Spring Exams Only)

Number of Final Exam Exemptions allowed:

- 1) Freshmen (9th-grade) – 2 Final Exam Exemptions are allowed.
- 2) Sophomores (10th-grade) – 3 Final Exam Exemptions are allowed.
- 3) Juniors (11th-grade) – 4 Final Exam Exemptions are allowed.

Grade Qualification:

- 4) An average of the 3rd and 4th grading periods of at least a 70.

Missing Assignments:

4. No zeros for any Major Grades in both the 3rd or 4th nine weeks.
5. No more than 3 zeros for Daily Grades for the 3rd nine weeks, and no more than 3 zeros for Daily Grade for the 4th nine weeks.
6. X = Exempt; Z = Zero

Discipline Qualification:

- 1) ISS Assignments – Zero for either semester
- 2) DAEP/JJAEP assignments – Zero for either semester

Hold List Qualification:

- 1) A student may not be on the hold list at the time of the exemption. This list includes payments owed, fines, fees, equipment, uniforms, books, instruments, or other school items not returned or lost.

Administration may change the decision of the exemption for students based on extenuating circumstances. Assistant principals will review and make a recommendation to the Associate Principal of Administration for approval

Advanced Placement Class Exemptions for grades 9-11:

Any student that takes an AP exam, has at least a 70 average in the 3rd and 4th grading periods, and no zeros for a major assignment in the Spring semester may exempt the final exam. This exemption is in addition to the exemptions listed above.

Hold List:

The hold list is developed based on what students need to return or pay the school for items such as payments owed, fines, fees, equipment, uniforms, books, instruments, or other school items not returned or lost, etc.

Exemption Coupons:

Exemption coupons will be issued to the students one week prior to exams. Once the coupons are issued, no reprints will occur for any reason. If a student's exemption status changes after the coupon has been given to a teacher, the student will lose that exemption coupon and will not be reissued that coupon for a different exam (Example: The student meets the criteria for an exemption and turns in the coupon to a teacher. The student earns a zero for a major grade. The student is no longer exempt and that coupon is no longer available for another class).
