

**Seniors (Grade 12) (Spring Exams ONLY except for Government or Economics)**

**Number of Final Exemptions allowed for a Senior:**

- 1) 7 final exemptions are allowed + up to 2 mid-year exemptions (Government and/or Economics Only).

**Grade Qualification:**

- 1) An average of the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> for Gov/Eco) grading periods of at least a 70.

**Missing Assignments:**

1. No zeros for any Major Grades in both the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> nine weeks.
2. No more than 3 zeros for Daily Grades for the 3<sup>rd</sup> nine weeks, and no more than 3 zeros for Daily Grade for the 4<sup>th</sup> nine weeks.
3. X = Exempt; Z = Zero

**Discipline Qualification:**

- 1) ISS Assignments – Zero for either semester
- 2) OSS Assignments – Zero for either semester
- 3) DAEP/JJAEP assignments – Zero for either semester

**Hold List Qualification:**

- 1) A student may not be on the hold list at the time of the exemption. This list includes payments owed, fines, fees, equipment, uniforms, books, instruments, or other school items not returned or lost.

Administration may change the decision of the exemption for students based on extenuating circumstances. Assistant principals will review and make a recommendation to the Associate Principal of Administration for approval.

**Hold List:**

The hold list is developed based on items the student needs to return or pay the school: payment owed, fines, fees, equipment, uniforms, books, instruments, or other school items not returned or lost, etc.

**AP Classes:**

All SENIORS can exempt any AP class if the above criteria is met.

\*All UNDERCLASSMEN who take an AP exam can be exempt from the End of the Year final if all other requirements listed above are met. UNDERCLASSMEN who do not choose to take the AP exam will be required to take the end of the year exam.

**DC Classes:**

All SENIORS can exempt any DC class if they above criteria is met.

All UNDERCLASSMEN will be required to take a final exam for all DC classes. The university exam does not qualify as the end of the year exam.

***\*There are NO other exemptions for UNDERCLASSMEN.***
