#### Tardy Policy

Students are expected to be in their assigned classrooms when the tardy bell rings. Each student is allowed six tardies per semester, and each of those six tardies is a warning. The purpose of the warnings is to help students deal with mishaps in the hall, bad weather, heavy traffic, etc. When a student exceeds six tardies, the student will begin receiving consequences from their Assistant Principal. Tardies will start over after each semester. Students seen intentionally being tardy may have all tardy privileges revoked and consequences elevated. Students who drive to school may have additional consequences including suspension of parking and/or loss of parking privileges.

#### LUNCH DROP-OFF POLICY:

Safety is the upmost importance for our students. For the safety of our students, all lunches brought in to school for your student will need to be signed in at the front office. Lunches will be taken to the AP office for the students to pick-up. There will be NO food deliveries accepted by any outside vendor. Parking is \$75 and can be paid at SchoolCash <u>Online</u>. For more information, please contact Mr. Koslosky.


#### VERIFICATION OF ENROLLEMENT (VOE) INFORMATION:

Obtaining a VOE is the responsibility of the student and the student alone. As of this year, we will no longer be accepting email and phone request for VOE's.

VOE request must be made 24 hours in advance of when they are needed. To obtain a VOE, have your student come to the AP's office and use the iPad to sign in and select Request VOE as their reason. Their VOE form will be ready 24 hours later, and they will need to come back to the office to pick it up and show a picture ID when doing so. <u>VOE forms cannot and will not be emailed</u>. Absolutely no exceptions.






