

#### Tardy Policy

Students are expected to be in their assigned classrooms when the tardy bell rings. Each student is allowed six tardies per semester, and each of those six tardies is a warning. The purpose of the warnings is to help students deal with mishaps in the hall, bad weather, heavy traffic, etc. When long! a student exceeds six tardies, the student will begin receiving conseguences from their Assistant Principal. Tardies will start over after each semester. Students seen intentionally being tardy may have all tardy privileges revoked and consequences elevated. Students who drive to school may have additional consequences including suspension of parking and/or loss of parking privileges.

#### LUNCH DROP-OFF POLICY:


