

Parents and Students,

We want to make sure that everyone is off to a great start. In order to do so, we want to remind parents and students of information in the handbook about deliveries to students during the school day. At the high school level, it is important that students take on the responsibility of being prepared for each day prior to leaving their home. It is a great opportunity for parents to help guide their child through this process and encourage them along the way. In addition, it is appropriate for parents to allow their child to suffer natural consequences for not being prepared for the day. This will strengthen their character and prepare them for life after high school.

As concerns have grown over school safety the country, schools and districts have adjusted their protocols related building access. In an effort to keep our students and staff safe, access to the campus will be limited to visitors and they must utilize the intercom/video system to announce their arrival. We ask that you limit your need to access the campus to meetings/conferences and picking up your child. We will accept deliveries on a limited basis but ask that you work with your child to be prepared with all assignments and a lunch for the day. It helps them take ownership and responsibility for their daily life and, in the end of the four years, improves independence and college readiness. Please know that they will navigate the situations that arise and will grow from each one. (Note: the school is not responsible for items that are dropped off for students and will not be monitored. This is at your own risk situation.)

1. If you decided to bring an item to campus for your child, you will request access to the front office area and leave the item on a cart by the receptionist.
2. All items collected will be moved to the Assistant Principals office area for students at the beginning of each class period. Students will be able to stop by the assistant principals office during passing periods or lunch to collect the item left for them.
3. Please remember that food items that are delivered for a student by the parent should be for the student only. Due to health and safety issues, you cannot deliver food for a group of students. Please note that we are unable to accept any items that are delivered by a restaurant or food delivery service.
4. In order to maintain the best learning environment please know that we are unable to accept any delivery from an outside vendor (flowers, balloons, food) for students.
5. Car services, such as Lyft and Uber, are not allowed to pick students up for appointments or to travel from school in any method.
6. Please remember that this is an opportunity for students to learn responsibility. Please work to hold them accountable for getting their belongings and lunch together in the mornings and it is ok to not come to their aide so quick. Learning that responsibility before leaving for College soon is a great lesson for all.
