



What level of classes should I choose? Things to consider...

- What are your choices? (Level, Honors, or AP)
- What is your teacher's advisement?

- How many other advanced level courses are you taking?

Honors, Dual Credit, and AP What does that mean?

- **Honors** is more rigorous than a level course. It helps the student to prepare for the AP course later.
- Dual Credit is when a student earns both high school credit and college credit at the same time. Must meet testing requirements before enrolling in class. Assuming course is passed, credit is automatic at Texas public colleges/universities.
- **AP** is considered college level work. AP exams are more widely accepted; however, it does depend on the university you attend. Possibility of earning multiple course credits if you pass the AP exam with a score of a 3, 4, or 5.

Advanced Course **Agreement Form**

When registration closes, the **Advanced Course Agreement** will be emailed to you through your PAC account.

Students and Parents who do not sign the ACA will be dropped from the advanced courses.

Conroe Independent School District Student and Parent Agreement for Enrollment in Advanced Courses Honory, AP, Dual Credit

CISD encourages all students to enroll in available advanced placement (AP) and Honors classes to enhance their academic experience. Any CISD student may entroll in Honors or AP classes as his or her schedule permits.

AP and Homen classes offer a high degree of right designed to prepare the student for success in higher academic pursuits. The purpose of an Hences course is to propage students, for college-level work which they will experience in AP classes. AP courses provide college-level instruction and outminute in AP exams that are designed by the College Board. Students who successfully complete AP exams may receive

- > Characteristics of an Honors, AP, Doal Credit class are:
 - Student-initiated learning with an emphasis on strong work effect.
 - Rigorous academic context in AP requiring reading proficiency;
 - More depth and complexity
 - Application of contest strategies.
 - Consistent use of higher-level thinking skills
 - Assignments are more analytical
 - Required commitment to course inside and outside of classerson.

AP courses differ from regular high school courses in that instructure use advanced curricula that is outlined by the College Board and authorized. through the College Board's sudit process. Honors courses focus skill development, habits of mind, and in-depth proparation in a subject area that is necessary to master the skills required to achieve success in AP courses. Other characteristics of advanced courses include context immersion, a fast page, and assessment of performance at the analysis and synthesis levels.

While we expect students to be very successful in Honors, AP, or Dual Credit classes, a close look at the student's total course load and commitments to other activities should be taken into deliberation when choosing how many of these courses to take during a sensester. For some attailents, the heat way to begin morning into these courses in by beginning with one, until they better understand the expectations and time commissions involved.

CISD strongly believes that Honors, AP, and Dual Credit courses provide enhanced academic opportunities for students that will assist them in future academic or nonacademic purvairs. It is essential that the student give his her maximum effort to succeed.
