Local Scholarship season is in full swing. Please take advantage

of the opportunities in our community!

you log into Naviance, click on colleges at the top of the page, then click on scholarship search, and you will see all of our local scholarships.

When you do this, all the local scholarships that we have received applications for will appear. I always suggest that you sort them by due date. There are only a few now, but we will receive a TON more as the semester progresses.

Here are some tips:

- 1. Set a reminder to check for new scholarships once a week.
- 2. Read the application to see if you meet the requirements before you start.

3. Don't just read the title of the scholarships! For example, the Montgomery County Fair Scholarship does

NOT require fair participation. Neither does the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Scholarship.

4. If you have a parent/guardian to help you read through applications and tell you which ones you meet the

qualifications on, that's super helpful...but not a requirement.

5. Most scholarships require some sort of writing/essay—DO NOT FREAK OUT. Most do not have a large requirement of words. Most will want you to write about:

- A. Why do you need the money?
- B. What do you want to study/major in/be when you grow up?

6. Most will require a resume or for you to write out all your activities-so get it prepared

- A. Resumes can be longer than one page, that's completely normal.
- B. Any format organization is fine, as long as it makes sense—you can separate by year, activity, awards, etc.
- 7. Read how to get the application to the committee:
 - A. Some want you to mail and have a postmark (when we mail it) deadline.
 - B. Some will have a received by deadline so you need to plan ahead.
 - C. Some will be turned into the College and Career Center.

Printing is FREE in the CCC. Most of these scholarships will require you to print an application and complete it. You can always print for free in 1619. Ms. Jones is the scholarship guru...she will print and make copies of things for you, teach you how to scan documents with your phone, and explain when to turn things in if you have questions.

Tardy Policy

Students are expected to be in their assigned classrooms when the tardy bell rings. Each student is allowed six tardies per semester, and each of those six tardies is a warning. The purpose of the warnings is to help students deal with mishaps in the hall, bad weather, heavy traffic, etc. When a student exceeds six tardies, the student will begin receiving conseguences from their Assistant Principal. Tardies will start over after each semester. Students seen intentionally being tardy may have all tardy privileges revoked and consequences elevated. Students who drive to school may have additional consequences including suspension of parking and/or loss of parking privileges.

Bus Arrival Text Notification Option for Parents/Guardians

Conroe ISD Transportation now has the capability to send parents/guardians bus stop arrival text notifications. For information on how to register for optional parent notifications go to the link below or scan the QR code and click the SMART tag[™] Parent Portal Registration link. Once you are at our website, follow the instructions to start receiving text notifications when your child's bus is approximately 15 minutes away from the designated stop.

Important Information:

- 1) The Smart tag[™] Parent Notification system works effectively when drivers are able to follow their routes exactly as they are designed in the District's routing system. When there is a situation such as a wreck, weather issue, etc., the route may be impacted. The driver may need to deviate from their designated path and approach the bus stop from another direction. If there is a deviation in the direction, the system may not send out the 15-minute arrival notification. Please contact your feeder Transportation Center if this occurs on a regular basis.
- To access and receive your child's bus stop information, you must create an account through the Smart Tag Parent Portal link above.
- 3) Instructional videos, links to additional information, and a Q&A section can also be found in the Smart Tag Parent Portal.
- 4) We ask for patience as we analyze incoming data and make necessary adjustments during implementation of the Smart Tag system.
