The AT assigned to College Park is a 26-year-old female, who loves watching movies, visiting museums, and enjoys being out in nature. She is very excited to experience American culture and looks forward to trying

American home-cooked meals with her host family.

The AT is not an exchange student, and receives a monthly salary, funded by the Japanese government. As part of the J-LEAP Program requirements, the host school has to find a host family in the CPHS community for the AT to live with as the AT acclimates to life in The Woodlands, TX. The minimal requirements of the host family would be to have an available guest room, a willingness to host the AT and transport her to and from school until she purchases a car, and an openness to share American culture and your family culture.

If you are interested in sharing your culture and being a host family, please contact Elizabeth Hojo (ehojo@conroeisd.net) directly. The accepted host family will receive a small stipend to help offset costs for meals and utilities. All ATs will be fully vaccinated with 3 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine before starting the J-LEAP Program. Host families should expect to host the AT minimally from her arrival to Houston on July 24th, 2023 until November 30th, 2023. After November 30th, the AT can continue to reside with the host family if they both agree, or the AT may find another living arrangement on their own. 


