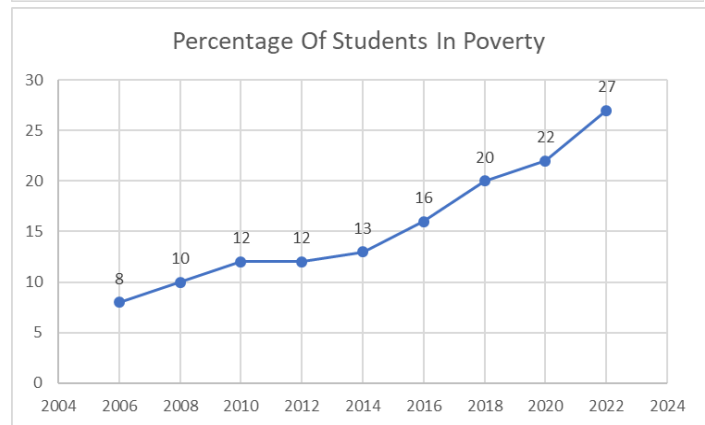
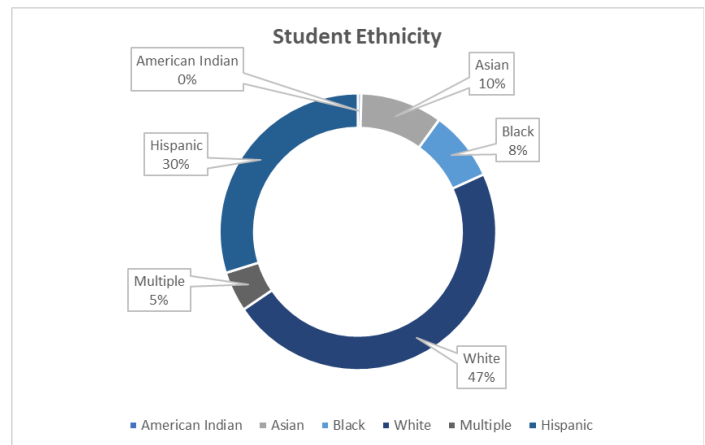

Our Students



Our District & Community

Conroe Independent School District is the 11th largest school district in Texas, comprised of more than 70,000 students attending more than 60 schools across six traditional feeder zones, and one academic alternative high school. Three specialized competitive magnet programs are available for students. The Woodlands, one of the nation's premier master planned communities, is home to more than 100,000 people. Located 27 miles north of downtown Houston, The Woodlands is an important regional center for more than 1000 businesses. Most residents in this upscale suburb are employed in professional or managerial positions with an average family income of \$110,000.

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Our Academic Year

The Woodlands College Park is divided into two 18-week semesters (August-December and January-May). Our seven daily class periods are each approximately 50 minutes. College Park students are expected to graduate on the Texas Foundation with endorsement plan including: 4 credits in English, 4 credits of Math (to include Algebra 2), 4 credits of Science (Biology, Chemistry, Physics or Principles of Technology, and 1 additional science), 4 credits of Social Studies, 2 credits of Foreign Language, one Fine Arts course, one Physical Education course, and Health. Class rank is based on the cumulative grade point average for grades 9-12. A student's grade point average is determined by dividing the total number of grade points by the number of semester courses attempted. All state accredited courses are considered in the calculation. Grade points are awarded according to course rigor.

Our COVID 19 Response

For the last quarter of the 2019-2020 school year, Conroe ISD provided asynchronous learning for all grades. For the full 2020-2021 academic year, students were permitted by the district to choose between in-person or remote learning. District-wide, students followed the same grading scale and earned the same credits and across both learning platforms. Since the 2021-2022 academic year, all CISD high school students have returned to in-person learning.

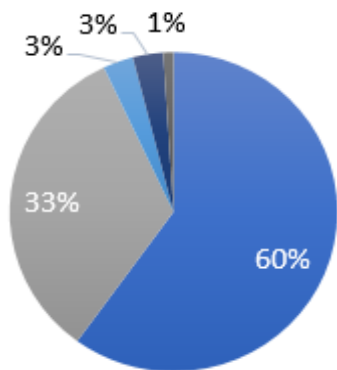

SPECIAL PROGRAMS-THE ACADEMY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

The Woodlands College Park High School houses the Academy of Science and Technology. The Academy is a group of students (75 per grade level), competitively selected across three feeder zones, whose curriculum focuses on science and technology. Academy students take their science, math, and technology classes within the Academy setting. Academy teachers work collaboratively with the College Park faculty and staff to enhance the curriculum and special interests of Academy students. All students, regardless of feeder zone home, are ranked together.
