Texas Requirements vs. Out of State

- Specific course requirements per subject area
- 26 credits needed to graduate
- Specific additional requirements other than core classes
- Grade classification based on credits earned
- 6 credits = 10th grade
- 12 credits = 11th grade
- 18 credits = 12th grade

- 3. Students will receive an AP Test Ordering Letter October 10, 2023 through their AP classes and by School Messenger.


