Do you enjoy writing? Are you interested in current events? Do you want to contribute to the greater good of the world through story-telling, reporting facts, and getting involved with your community or state?

Joining your high school newspaper may be for you! Newspaper gives students an opportunity to develop their writing skills, and keeps students, staff, and

teachers updated on school and community news. Get involved! You'll love it!

What Does a High School Newspaper Cover?

Participating in your high school newspaper will improve your writing skills and assist you in developing media and content for your portfolio or resume - something to start thinking about before you graduate from high school! Get involved, start early!

What will you pitch to the editors? Though specific topics will vary from organization to organization, most school papers cover topics that affect the school, students, and the surrounding community.

Common topics that school papers cover include:

School events - dances, sporting events, pep rallies, and assemblies School news – what's happening in the school and policies Interviews with new students and staff – getting to know your school from the inside out School accomplishments, awards, clubs, and performing groups Community news – the symbiotic relationship with the outside Reviews of movies, music, podcasts, TV shows teenagers watch Study and Lifestyle tips, which classes to take, science advances, robotics, and more...

Common Newspaper Jobs (Sarikas, 2015)

How to Join Your High School Paper

Most school newspapers have a teacher who supervises the paper. Please contact Jennifer Buergermeister and ask how you can get involved in the journalism program at College Park. You may need to enroll in a high school journalism class to be part of the newspaper depending on your writing experience. All students enrolled in newspaper or other journalism classes will receive academic credit, similar to other classes. The students typically work on the newspaper and writing articles during class, though it is likely students will work on stories outside of class time (especially photojournalism students).

If you are interested in joining Newspaper, Photojournalism, Journalism I, and eventually Yearbook (Yearbook has mandatory prerequisites) in one of the upcoming semesters, consult with your English teacher or email the newspaper adviser, Jennifer Buergermeister at jbuergermeister@conroeisd.net.

Tardy Policy

Students are expected to be in their assigned classrooms when the tardy bell rings. Each student is allowed six tardies per semester, and each of those six tardies is a warning. The purpose of the warnings is to help students deal with mishaps in the hall, bad weather, heavy traffic, etc. When a student exceeds six tardies, the student will begin receiving consequences from their Assistant Principal. Tardies will start over after each semester. Students seen intentionally being tardy may have all tardy privileges revoked and consequences elevated. Students who drive to school may have additional consequences including suspension of parking and/or loss of parking privileges.



LUNCH DROP-OFF POLICY: There will be NO food deliveries accepted by

any outside vendor. Safety is the upmost importance for our students. For the safety of our students, all lunches brought in to school for your student will need to be signed in at the front office. The program offers a curriculum that allows students to recognize and develop personal leader-


ship skills, explore best leadership practices, and learn how to initiate positive


