

College Park High School Celebrates Students Awarded with Academic Honors from College Board National Recognition Programs Awards recognize high-performing students and help them stand out to colleges.

Students at College Park HS earned academic honors from the College Board National Recognition Programs. These programs celebrate

students' hard work in high school and showcase their strong academic performance. The academic honors for rural area, Black, Indigenous, and/or Latino students are an opportunity for students to share their strong academic achievements with colleges and scholarship programs that are seeking to recruit diverse talent.

At College Park HS 36 students received the academic honor.

"We're thrilled to celebrate our students and recognize them for the great work they've been doing. We're proud of their strong academic performance in the class-room and on College Board assessments like the PSAT/NMSQT®, PSAT™ 10, and AP® exams," said Dr. Mark Murrell. "There's so much that makes our students unique, and receiving this honor reinforces this as an asset for their future."

The criteria for eligible students include: GPA of 3.5 or higher. PSAT/NMSQT or PSAT 10 assessment scores that are within the top 10% of assessment takers in each state for each award program or earned a score of 3 or higher on 2 or more AP Exams in 9th and 10th grade. Attend school in a rural area or small town, or identify as African American/Black, Hispanic American/Latino, or Indigenous/Native.

Eligible students are invited to apply on BigFuture during their sophomore or junior year and are awarded at the start of the next school year in time to share their achievements in high school as they plan for the future. At the same time, colleges and organizations using College Board's Student Search Service™ can connect directly with awardees during the recruitment process.

"It's becoming increasingly hard for students to be 'seen' during the college recruitment process. We're exceptionally proud of the National Recognition Programs for celebrating students who are at times overlooked but have shown their outstanding academic abilities," said Tarlin Ray, senior vice president of BigFuture® at College Board. "This is a benefit not only for students but also for colleges and universities

Tardy Policy

Students are expected to be in their assigned classrooms when the tardy bell rings. Each student is allowed six tardies per semester, and each of those six tardies is a warning. 

The program offers a curriculum that allows students to recognize and develop personal leadership skills, explore best leadership practices, and learn how to initiate positive change in their community.

What Does a High School Newspaper Cover?

Interviews with new students and staff – getting to know your school from the inside out

Reviews of movies, music, podcasts, TV shows teenagers watch



How to Join Your High School Paper

Most school newspapers have a teacher who supervises the paper. Please contact Jennifer Buergermeister and ask how you can get involved in the journalism program at College Park. You may need to enroll in a high school journalism class to be part of the newspaper depending on your writing experience. All students enrolled in newspaper or other journalism classes will receive academic credit, similar to other classes. The students typically work on the newspaper and writing articles during class, though it is likely students will work on stories outside of class time (especially photojournalism students).







OUTSIDE SPORTING EVENTS: As a CISD team, we met to discuss ways to help spectators and kids manage the heat and support the Cavaliers. The following are some adjustments/recommendations that we have made to help everyone stay safe while they support our teams:

- 1. Event Start times: the following are examples of efforts to adjust times to help with heat. Events begin 1 hour later than planned if possible. Play tennis matches that are necessary, or run/workout early mornings.
- 2. Examples: We have delayed start times for events as possible to help with heat. Friday nights football game at Cinco Ranch will begin at 7:30 p.m. The next week home game, on Thursday vs. Klein Cain, will begin at 8 p.m.
- 3. Examples: Tennis has been asked to play the necessary matches only during this time of heat to minimize the time kids and spectators are at the events.
- 4. Examples: Cross Country is running mainly in the morning.
- 5. Stay Hydrated start days prior to an event and then consume a lot of water leading up to the event and during an event.
- 6. Do not arrive to the event until necessary. Stay in cars or a cool place until it is close to the start time.
- 7. Find ways to periodically move around, use the restroom and find some shade for a few minutes.
- 8. Remember that age and health can play a major role in handling the heat. Individuals that have a medical condition, are elderly, or very young should consider staying at home during the events until the weather improves. (Varsity Football games will be broadcasted via radio and home games will be live streamed)

Please remember that stadiums do not allow outside beverages in the facilities but CISD facilities will allow you to bring in an empty container or sealed water bottle into events. You are able to fill/refill at the water fill/water fountain stations at the stadium.
