

Deliveries

We want to ensure that everyone is off to a great start. To that end, we want to remind parents and students of information in the handbook about deliveries to students during the school day.

At the high school level, students must take on the responsibility of being prepared for each day before leaving home. Parents play a vital role in guiding their children through this process and encouraging them along the way. Your involvement is key in allowing your children to face the natural consequences of not being prepared, which will ultimately strengthen their character and prepare them for life after high school.

Given the increasing concerns over school safety, schools and districts have adjusted their protocols related to building access. Our school is committed to ensuring the safety of our students and staff, which is why we have limited campus access for visitors. We ask for your cooperation in this matter and to limit your need to access the campus to meetings/conferences and picking up your child.

We will accept deliveries on a limited basis but ask that you work with your child to be prepared with all assignments and a lunch for the day.

(Note: the school is not responsible for items dropped off for students and will not be monitored. This is at your own risk.)

1. If you decide to bring an item to campus for your child, you will request access to the front office area and leave the item on a cart by the receptionist.
2. All items collected will be moved to the Assistant Principal's office area for students at the beginning of each class period. Students will be able to stop by the assistant principal's office during passing periods or lunch to collect the items left for them.
3. Please remember that food items a parent delivers for a student should be for the student only. Due to health and safety issues, you cannot provide food for a group of students. Please note that we cannot accept any items delivered by a restaurant or food delivery service.
4. To maintain the best learning environment, please know that we cannot accept student deliveries from outside vendors (flowers, balloons, food).
5. Car services, such as Lyft and Uber, are not allowed to pick students up for appointments or to travel from school in any method.
6. Please remember that this is an opportunity for students to learn responsibility. Please work to hold them accountable for getting their belongings and lunch together in the mornings
